**Pupil Success – Mrs K. Clarke, KS4 English Co-ordinator**

Niamh Whelan, 11NWE entered and won two competitions during lockdown. One was a poetry competition that Mrs Clarke set as an extended learning task and the other the Bernie Simons Essay Competition. The Bernie Simons Essay Competition invited pupils from Year 9 to Year 13 in state schools across England to write an essay on Civil Liberties.

Niamh’s essay was one of six selected by the judges as winning entries. Niamh’s prize is a place on a mentoring programme whereby Niamh will benefit from a combination of work experience, career mentoring and academic resources sponsored by Simons, Muirhead and Burton a leading London law firm set up by the late human rights advocate, Bernie Simon.

- ❖ They would like help in how to organise their work at home, and how to get really useful support from a teacher when they are working at home.





We do have a number of families at any time who are self-isolating. For those pupils who are at home, and not unwell, staff should provide work. **Royal British Legion Poppy Day Appeal November 2020**

This year we cannot sell poppies in school because of the Covid 19 restrictions that are in place. However, we are committed to supporting the RBL Poppy Day Appeal. Therefore, we will be holding a mufti day on Friday 23rd October to raise money.

Pupils and staff will be asked to contribute at least £2 putting money into buckets on arrival at the school. The money collected will be quarantined over half term, and this means we can share a total with you in the week of 11th November. That week our assembly will mark the courage and efforts of those who lost their lives, from all backgrounds and cultures, but focusing especially on our local community.

### **Wootton Upper School Local Governing Board vacancies**

The Local Governing Board which oversees the work of Wootton Upper School has a vacancy for a parent governor and also a vacancy for a teaching staff governor. The Governing Board meets each half-term. ### **Good neighbours – parking at the front of the school**

We would like to ask for your help and support in enabling us to maintain good relations with the residents who live closest to the school. There is limited parking at the front of the school and some of the cars which arrive to collect our pupils are being parked on private land opposite the school, or, where they are parked on the carriageway blocking entrances to people's property.

Bedfordshire Police and our Borough Councillor, Cllr John Wheeler, have both asked us to bring this matter to your attention in our newsletter. At the beginning of the school year we asked that where children are being collected by private car, parents/carers refrained from arriving before the buses had left which would mean that parents/carers could then drive onto the site to collect children. We would hope that almost all parents/carers could manage to do this, since our 2:30 pm finish is much earlier than other schools. Thank you in anticipation of your support.
