#### Senior Student Leaders

- This is the most senior and most prestigious position within the school leadership team. There are 19 Senior School Leaders that have all been personally selected by SLT.
- In this role they will:
  - Serve as a principal ambassador for the school, representing the school community to the highest possible standard.
  - They will uphold the ethos and values of the school at all times.
  - Represent the views of Wootton Upper School students.
  - Promote Wootton Upper School in a positive way to pupils across all phases of the school.
  - Maintain high standards of dress, behaviour and attitude

## Student Wellbeing Ambassadors



- This role involves you working with staff and peers to ensure that students feel safe, supported and cared for in school.
- In this role you will:
  - Help educate and inform students about how they can keep themselves safe and healthy.
  - Work closely with students and staff to identify opportunities to promote student welfare throughout the school.
  - Represent the views of the wider student body on how the school can make changes to support pupils wellbeing

## Diversity & Equality Ambassadors



- You will have the opportunity to promote the culture of acceptance of diversity throughout the school.
- In this role you will:
  - Help review and implement school policies.
  - Design and produce displays and work areas to develop a more inclusive environment.
  - Help develop and deliver resources and materials that can be used as part of staff training.
  - Aid evaluation of acceptance and consider ways forward

#### Inclusion Ambassadors



- You will be given the opportunity to provide a voice of the pupils in how the school can provide a better inclusive culture for those pupils that have SEND needs.
- In this role you will:
  - Work directly with staff to discuss what more can be done to ensure there are equal opportunities for all pupils
  - Create learning material/training for peers and staff to educate them on everyone's diverse needs
  - Develop a community where everyone feels equal, and everyone's voice is heard

## Environmental Ambassadors



- You will look at creating awareness, consciousness, and action on reducing harm to our planet and identifying potential ways our school can be more environmentally friendly.
- In this role you will:
  - Work with staff to see what can be changed to improve the schools' policies.
  - Develop creative ideas to improve the environment through to implementation.
  - Work to promote the work of the environmental group by actively sharing your achievements with your peers, teachers, parents and the wider community.

#### Careers Ambassadors



- You will be working with the Careers Coordinator in school to provide pupils at Wootton with as many possibilities in their next steps and finding the right path for everyone.
- In this role you will:
  - Work with the local community to ensure that all possibilities are shared with pupils at Wootton, this could involve organising external agencies to come into school
  - Represent the views of the wider student body and help to conduct student surveys and organise focus groups that allow students to share their views and the support they need

## Subject Ambassadors (1)



- This role involves you working with teaching staff to help promote the quality of teaching and learning throughout the school. There will be a subject ambassador for EVERY subject in the school.
- In this role you will:
  - Meet regularly with subject leaders to discuss and review teaching and learning.
  - Help develop and deliver resources and materials that can be used as part of staff training.
  - Provide opportunities for student feedback on the quality of teaching (e.g through questionnaires, focus groups, etc.).

#### Anti-Bullying Ambassadors



- As an Anti-Bullying Ambassador, you will be trained by The Diana Award Anti-Bullying Campaign. Your role is to help educate your peers on bullying.
- In this role you will:
  - Take part in The Diana Award Anti-Bullying training
  - Lead on anti-bullying campaigns, promote a culture which celebrates and tolerates difference and help keep your peers safe both online and offline
  - Be involved in community projects to help educate peers

#### Social Media Ambassadors



- This role involves you working with the school to help develop the social media presence of the school and show the local community some of the amazing work that is being done at Wootton.
- In this role you will:
  - Create content that can be shared via Wootton Upper School's social media accounts
  - Work with the school to highlight some of the important and great work that is being done and think creatively in how this can be shared with the local community
  - Help build strong presence online that expresses Wootton's main ethos and standards

#### Transition Ambassadors



- This role will involve you working with our feeder middle schools and new pupils to help ensure a smooth and comfortable transition into Wootton Upper School.
- In this role you will:
  - Visit local middle schools to be a positive role model for year 8's that will be joining Wootton next year.
  - Help greet new pupils into the school by providing tours, answering questions and being a familiar face for new starters

#### **Student Council**

This will consist of 5 pupils from each year's pupil voice, forming a student council of 15 pupils

They will bring the opinions and views from the pupil voice and will meet fortnightly with Mr Saunders to discuss actions
