




Your GCSEs

- Think about the style of learning that suits you best.
- Do you prefer:
 - Mainly theory-based subjects?
 - More practical-based subjects?
 - Subjects that allow you to express opinions and have more structured writing?
- GCSE courses are mostly 'linear' exams take place at the end of the course.
- Other courses (BTEC/Cambridge Nationals) have significant aspect that is based on 'controlled assessment' or 'NEA'





EBacc (English Baccalaureate)

- The DfE has acted on research suggesting that some subjects are better at facilitating more career choices than others.
- The EBACC recognises where students have received a good pass across a set of subjects.
- Students must gain a grade 5 (or higher) in the following:
 - English
 - Maths
 - Science Combined Science / Separate sciences /
 Computer Science
 - History / Geography
 - Modern Foreign Language (MFL) French/Spanish

Almost essential for students wishing to apply to top universities (i.e. <u>think seriously about the implications of</u> not taking a MFL)



Core Curriculum (compulsory)

- English Language (GCSE)
- English Literature (GCSE)
- Maths (GCSE)
- Combined Science or Separate GCSEs
 (Biology, Chemistry and Physics)
- PE (Core)
- PRE (Core)
- PSHCE / Careers (non-examination)





Core/Option Programme

 Students will be asked to choose if they wish to follow PRE through to a GCSE <u>or</u> undertake Core PRE lessons. Choose 1 of the following:

• Choice 1:

- GCSE Philosophy, Religion and Ethics (PRE) 4 lessons
- Core PE 2 lessons

Choice 2:

- Core Philosophy, Religion and Ethics (PRE) 2 lessons
- Core PE 4 lessons
- (You may also take BTEC Sport as one of your main option subjects as well as Core PE)





Options subjects

Students will then choose 4 additional option subjects from the list on the next slide.

At least one of these choices must include **Geography** or **History** (although you may do both)







Choose subjects in which you have an interest







Step 3 - Click on Register with an external account






Then choose a <u>reserve</u> in each block (the subject changes to orange) Again this is displayed in priority order





What is Pupil Premium

The pupil premium grant is funding to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in state-funded schools in England. We have used evidence based interventions to ensure our students are supported at Wootton Academy Trust.

It aims to:

- supporting the high-quality teaching, such as staff professional development
- providing targeted academic support, such as tutoring
- tackling non-academic barriers to academic success, such as difficulties in attendance, behaviour and social and emotional wellbeing



Pupil eligibility

The following groups are eligible for pupil premium:

 pupils who are recorded as eligible for free school meals, or have been recorded as eligible in the past 6 years, including eligible children of families who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)

Eligibility For Free School Meals

Your child could get a free school meal if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (with annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax and not including any benefits you get)


